## What is a Green Career in the NHS?

A green career in the NHS is any role that helps reduce the environmental impact of healthcare while improving patient care. These roles support the NHS' goal to become the **world's first net-zero health system**, meaning it will no longer contribute to climate change through carbon emissions.

Sustainability is part of **every** NHS role, whether you're reducing waste, saving energy, or helping patients access care digitally.

The NHS is responsible for **4–5%** of the UK's total carbon emissions.

Over **£300 million** worth of medicines go unused each year, contributing to waste and pollution.

In 2020, the NHS committed to reaching net zero:

- By 2040 for emissions it will directly control.
- By 2045 for emissions it can influence.

NHS-related travel makes up **3.5% of all road miles** in England, affecting air quality and public health.

## **Career Case Studies**

## **Clinical Roles**

Even traditional healthcare roles can support sustainability. Here are some real examples:

#### **Pharmacists**

The East Sussex Healthcare NHS Trust started a longterm Medicines Value Programme to make the use of expensive medicines more efficient and sustainable.

They introduced changes like switching to cheaper versions of costly biologic drugs and standardising drug doses to cut down on waste and streamline pharmacy work.

Since the programme began, it has saved £3.7 million, reduced medicine waste, improved patient safety, and strengthened teamwork between pharmacy staff, clinical teams, and patients.



#### **Allied Health Professionals**

The Home Enteral Feeding Team (HEFT) at Gloucestershire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust looks after about 500 patients who need tube feeding.

They checked what would happen if they switched from single-use bottles to reusable ones and used giving sets for longer. This change could save 24,722 kg of CO<sub>2</sub>e every year if done throughout the Trust, while also improving care and being more sustainable.



## Doctors & Nurses In 2022, a team at Solihull

Hospital performed the world's first net zero carbon operation.

By making changes to their standard practice, this groundbreaking surgical team reduced the carbon output by almost 80% (equivalent to a diesel car travelling around 5,500 miles), with no impact on the outcome for their patient.

### **Non-Clinical Roles**

Behind the scenes, many NHS staff are working to make healthcare greener:

# Estates & Facilities United Lincolnshire Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust won the 2021 Innovation Award for their sustainability efforts.

They received £2.6 million to replace 12,000 lights with energy-saving LED ones, cutting energy use and costs. This helps lower their carbon footprint and saves money for patient care.

Working with Veolia, they've also improved energy systems by installing LED lights and a new heat and power unit. These changes are expected to save £1.4 million each year and reduce carbon emissions by 7,712 tonnes.



#### **Digital Transformation Teams**

The NHS Digital and NHSX
Transformation Team
developed the Wayfinder
Service NHS App. This app lets
patients handle appointments
online, cutting carbon emissions
by over 1,100 tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>e each
year - 97.8% less than using
paper letters.

Moving to digital tools is crucial as it lowers paper usage, reduces travel, and decreases missed appointments.



#### **Procurement Specialists**

NHS Supply Chain started a program called the Evergreen Sustainable Supplier Assessment and set out five key requirements for suppliers.

Now, **94%** of their £4.4 billion spending involves suppliers with eco-friendly plans. This is important because buying sustainably affects the whole supply chain and helps cut down on indirect emissions. These steps are essential for creating a more sustainable NHS.

## Your Path to a Green Career

The NHS is on a mission to become the **world's first netzero health system**, and we need people like **you** to help us get there. Whether you're just starting or planning your next step, there are exciting ways to join the NHS and make a real difference for people and the planet.

## **University**

If you're thinking about university, there are many degrees that can lead to green NHS careers:

- **Healthcare Science** Work with cutting-edge technology to improve patient care and reduce waste.
- **Environmental Health** Help protect communities from pollution and climate-related health risks.
- Sustainable Design or Engineering Design eco-friendly hospitals and healthcare equipment.
- Digital Health and Informatics Use data and tech to reduce travel, paper use, and emissions.

Many NHS roles require a degree, but they also offer placement opportunities, graduate schemes, and research roles focused on sustainability.


## **Apprenticeships**

Apprenticeships are a fantastic way to start your NHS career while helping build a greener, more sustainable health service. You'll earn while you learn, gain hands-on experience, and contribute to the NHS's goal of reaching net zero carbon emissions.

Apprenticeships are available at different levels, from entrylevel to degree-level, and they're open to school leavers, career changers, and anyone passionate about making a difference.

Here are four example apprenticeship pathways that support sustainability in different ways:

- **Pharmacy Assistants and Technicians**: Help cut down on unused medicines and packaging waste.
- Customer Service Practitioner: Promote digital access to care, reduce travel, improve efficiency in patient communications.
- Healthcare Science Practitioner: Use data and innovation to reduce waste, improve efficiency, and support low-carbon care.
- Business Administrator: Help reduce paper use by supporting digital systems, assist with sustainability reporting, and contribute to eco-friendly office practices.





## **Entry-Level Roles**

These roles are a brilliant way to get started in the NHS and build experience:

- **Healthcare Assistants**: Support patients while promoting sustainable care practices.
- Porter: Support efficient logistics, reduce unnecessary transport, and help implement low-emission delivery methods.
- **Estates Technicians**: Maintain hospital buildings and equipment with a focus on energy efficiency.
- Admin and Support Roles: Help teams go paperless and reduce travel through digital systems.

Many roles offer on-the-job training and can lead to further qualifications or apprenticeships.

## Volunteering

- **What it is**: Giving your time to support NHS services, patients, or community health projects.
- Why it matters: Volunteers help reduce pressure on services and often support eco-friendly initiatives like gardening, recycling, or digital support.
- How to get started: Look for NHS volunteering opportunities through your local hospital, GP practice, or community health service. You need to be 18+ to volunteer at ULTH, LCHS, and LPFT.
